The following grade schedules must be utilized to compute grades:

Determination of Semester and Final Grades

Grades 6 – 12

Should an F be recorded in the last grade period for a semester course (2nd or 4th nine-weeks), the student may receive an F as a failing average. Should an F be recorded in the 2nd semester average for a year long course, the student may receive an F as a final grade.

Description of Marking System

The following shall be used for each marking period:

Letter Grade F	Failing Achievement

* O, S, NI, U graded courses are not to have classroom work graded with A, A-, B, B-, C, C-, D, D-, F.

Incomplete Grades

Grades K – 12

Incomplete is a temporary mark which indicates a grade has been withheld until all assignments for the grading period have been completed. The time allowed to complete work is to be no longer than 10 school days, unless there are unusual health problems or an extended period of excused absence. In these circumstances special arrangements may be made with the building principal for an extension of the 10 day period.

After 10 days, the I (incomplete) may be converted to an F and averaged accordingly.

*Example: If a student is absent (excused) for five school days, she/he shall have no more than five school days to make-up work. If a student is absent (excused) twelve school days, he/ she shall have no more than 10 school days to make-up the work.

If a student is going to be absent for more than 20 consecutive school days with an excused medical condition, he/she may be eligible for Home Instruction.

NOTE: Unexcused absences may result in assigning a failing grade for incomplete student work.
